TEACHER'S NOTES:

Aim: to provide further practice of the perfect aspects. This worksheet is designed to be used in conjunction with unit 1.3.

Time: 40 minutes

Materials: photocopies of the worksheet for each student

- 1 Put students into pairs and ask them to do the quiz (number 1). Monitor as they work to see if there are any questions. Check answers with the class.
